### **Quote For Reflection**

### **Call To Worship**

Read Hebrews 1:1-4 in your Worship Guide. What examples from the Bible can you think of that God has spoken to us through our ancestors (our relatives that have lived before us)? Draw a picture of ways God spoke to us before Jesus came.

What is the writer of Hebrews telling us in these verses about Jesus?

**Song Of Adoration**

In today's *Song of Adoration*, "How Great Thou Art," it talks about how God created the universe. Go through the song and underline the things the song says God has made. Then, draw a picture of a few of them.



### **Scripture Reading and Sermon**

Read Psalm 119:33-40 as it is read to the church this morning. It talks about the importance of keeping God's commands.

Listen for the reasons Scott says keeping God's commands are important. Write one or two of them down below.

Then, listen for why Scott says keeping God's commands are difficult. Write one or two the things you know God wants you to do that you find hard to do.

How can we keep God's commands? Write your answer below. Then, at lunch, ask your parents this question. And compare your answers.
